


Richard Guardabascio will be having a Art Show at the Milford National Bank branch in Bellingham all of October.

To be a part of the updated member gallery you must complete the following questions:

1. Your first and last name:
1. A short (one paragraph) artist statement/bio for the main gallery page:
2. A longer (2-3 paragraph) full bio for the direct artist gallery page:
3. Select images you wish to represent you in the online gallery.
 - a. Check to make sure the images are saved in a .jpeg format
 - b. Resize images to 72 dpi
 - c. Check the "image size," it should be between 500-800 pixels wide at the biggest dimension
 - d. Title your images as follows:
Lastname-Firstname-Name-of-the-Artwork.jpg
(Sample: Close-Hannah-Sunflower.jpg)
4. Complete the following for EACH image you are submitting (3-20 images):
 - a. Title of the image
 - b. Short (1-3 sentence) description, such as the media or how you were inspired, etc.
 - c. List SOLD or NFS as appropriate
5. What is the title of the image would you like to serve as the thumbnail next to your name on the gallery list page?

Entries: \$20 for up to 2 pieces. Check and entry form must be mailed to the Franklin Art Association, 279 East Central Street, PMB #289, Franklin MA 02038, firm postmarked no later than November 5.

Drop-off: Tri County High School 147 Pond St Franklin Friday Nov 14, 4 - 8 pm (Front school doorway). When you see building, take a right, up to front of school vs. going straight to delivery area..
Pick-up: Tri County High School, Sun. Nov. 16, 3 - 4 pm

Artwork Requirements: Work must be original (no copies or use of copyrighted work), no previously exhibited art in FAA shows. Artwork must be no wider than 32", no higher than 36", including frame. Entries must be properly framed (no clip-on frames, saw-tooth hooks, fish-line) wire only - ready for hanging. Frames, glass, mats must be not dirty, chipped, damaged, and no wet paint. Work NOT meeting these guidelines will be rejected at check in.

Commission: All work sold will be subject to 20% commission.

Bin Work: Bin can be solo or shared. Bin art must be unframed, in clear envelopes, and all bin/small works must be clearly priced, with artist name. Small works: hand painted, 8 x 18 max. size for framed work, no craft objects, limit your pieces (space is limited); we reserve right to not include small work i call 508 528 1280.

Small works: space is limited, so limit your inventory (others can be kept in car to replenish). No crafty work, only hand paintings, framed works no larger than 8x10, fine art objects only, fine crafted jewelry/pottery/objects; note cards/post cards/photos/original art prints. Name/price on each piece. Business cards welcomed. No soliciting of outside organizations.

Raffle: If you can, please donate an original framed painting, print, or photograph and/or art related donation (ex: art book) for Scholarship Raffle. Raffle tickets will be sold during exhibit, until raffle drawing at 3 PM Sun Nov. 16. Contact Tina Guarino, [508-541-4885](tel:508-541-4885) / Tinaguarinoart@gmail.com. and/or bring donation to FAA meeting ONLY, no later than Nov mtg. Have artist name, title, medium on back of 2-D art pieces.

Exhibit & Reception: Please bring finger food, snacks, bottled water, soft drinks, coffee/tea, (with set ups for same), for food table. Sign up for donating food can be made at FAA Sept, Oct, Nov, monthly meetings. We need your help.

Awards: Exhibit will be a judged exhibit, by outside area judge. There will be First, Second, Third, Honorable Mention ribbons given in each of the above categories.
