I look forward to seeing you all at our meeting next week as we welcome Watercolor artist Carlie Degaetano.



Chris Lamb Toubeau: Chris will be showing four acrylic paintings which comprise a series called "Future Awash" which will be hung at the **Franklin Universalist Society Church** in Franklin, 262 Chestnut Street, Franklin, MA. The public reception will be 1:00 to 3:00 on Sunday, March 29. The show will be taken down May 3rd.

Chris describes this series: "I have a reoccurring subject of blue robots interacting with future humans and along with these characters, there is clearly a narrative being illustrated in which the Earth surface has been thrown into destruction by oil spills and the accompanying environmental fires and air pollution we've seen spoil pristine lands before. The perspectives used are shifting so that the viewer feels they are in a movie and the action is happening around them."

She hopes that all ages of viewers will get to see the work and will leave their thoughts in her comment book.

DECAY, CORROSION, RUST...

There are new shiny things all around us, but are they as interesting as an old rusted car, peeling paint on a run down building, or half fallen walls in a dilapidated castle. There is amazing beauty in the decayed, the corroded, the rusted... making those images more compelling and interesting than those of readily available brand new items!

Consider the amazing textures and colors in an abandoned, dilapidated factory, the rust on an old bike, contrasting plaster and lathing on a corroded wall and the myriad of possible captures in a junkyard. Neighborhoods, disparagingly called "run down", are treasure troves of "decayed" tumble down houses, "corroded" discarded toys, "rusted" cars, trash cans and so on.

Decay, Corrosion, Rust.... can take many forms; black and white, color, abstract - all photographic media are welcome.
