• March 3, 2021, 6:30pm:

FAA member Dennis Sardella will present "Science and Modern Art".

Someone comparing a medieval and modern artwork may find themselves puzzling, "How on earth did we get from there to here?" Art experienced two revolutionary periods that radically changed how artists saw and depicted the world, and that paralleled two revolutionary periods in which science underwent similar changes. This talk will be a visual exploration of how those two ways of seeing the world developed, and how they led from the "there" of medieval art to to the "here" of modern art."

Dennis Sardella has been a docent at the Museum of Russian Icons in Clinton since 2012, where he leads gallery tours and introduces visitors to the world of Russian icons. He also writes about icons, and speaks regularly to civic and church groups on the topics of religious icons and the role they play in Eastern Christian spirituality.

From 1967 until 2012 he was a tenured Professor of Chemistry at Boston College. In 1990 he became the founding director of the Boston College Presidential Scholars Program, a university-wide co-curricular honors program, and directed it until 2010. For 17 years he and his wife Marjorie, a fine art photographer, led groups of Boston College Presidential Scholars on month-long study trips to France, and it was during those trips that he began to speak to students about science and modern art.

• April 7, 2021, 6:30pm:

FAA member Marjorie Sardella will talk about her approach to photography.

• The NCC's Annual Juried Art Show:

The Norfolk Cultural Council (NCC) is pleased to announce the 2021 Norfolk VIRTUAL Juried Art Show! The NCC's Annual Juried Art Show will take on a new format in 2021 – it will be virtual!

In this annual show, previously held at the Norfolk Library, the NCC aims to showcase the work of artists from Norfolk and surrounding communities and celebrate their artistic accomplishments. This year, we are inviting artists to share their quarantine creations virtually with the community.

Because the art show will be online, there is no limit to the type or size of art that can be submitted (although there is a limit of two submissions per artist). Art can be in the form of 2D in a variety of media (painting, drawing, photography, printmaking, collages, flat textile/fiber art, etc.) or now also in 3D (sculpture, reliefs, carvings, etc.). All work must be original.

There is no cost to enter. And cash prizes will be awarded for top artworks. The **deadline to submit artwork for consideration is February 28**. The show will be viewable online from April 1 to July 1. A virtual reception and awards ceremony will be held on Thursday, April 8 at 7 p.m.

Welcome to the 2021 National Wildlife Photo Contest!

The *National Wildlife*[®] Photo Contest, which began five decades ago, celebrates the power of photography to advance conservation and connect both photographers and viewers with wildlife and the outdoors. The most compelling nature images can help protect wildlife in profound ways. This year, the *National Wildlife* Photo Contest is two contests in one, though you need to enter only once. All entered photos are viewed by NWF judges, and winners receive the recognition and prizes listed. All entered photos are also eligible for the People's Choice Award contest, and if allowed by entrant will be viewable in the <u>public gallery</u> and sharable with family and friends through social media.

We are excited to announce the following nine categories for entry in our 2021 contest:

NEW Portfolio Category: A submission of up to 10 images built around a common theme related to nature and conservation

Birds: Portraits and behavior

Mammals: Portraits and behavior

Baby Animals: Portraits and behavior of young animals of any species

Other Wildlife: Portraits and behavior (includes underwater life, reptiles, amphibians, insects, spiders, macro and more) Landscapes & Plants: Scenic views and plants from backyards to wild places

People in Nature: People enjoying the outdoors or connecting with nature and wildlife

Mobile: Nature, wildlife and people outdoors photographed with a mobile device (phone or tablet) Young Nature Photographers: For photographers age 13-17
