FAA member Marjorie Sardella will talk about her approach to photography.

Marjorie S. Sardella ~ Marjorie's love of photography began at the age of ten with her first Brownie Camera. She later painted in oils for several years, but eventually returned to her first love, photography. Having taken several photography courses in the past, at Boston College, she came to love the process of creating a finished photo from a developed negative in the darkroom, skills Marjorie now applies to her photographic works, using mostly traditional darkroom techniques in her "digital darkroom" when required. Often, her photographic works are mistaken for paintings, perhaps reflecting on her earlier experience in oil painting. For twenty years, Marjorie was the event photographer and Photo archivist for the Boston College Presidential Scholars Program, which involved traveling to France for over a month each year, offering her the opportunities to travel to other western European countries as well as ventures throughout the northeastern part of the US. Through the years, Marjorie's photos of land, sea, and cityscapes, of wildlife and people seek to capture moments in time that also evoke a sense of timelessness, inviting viewers to enter into a world that rouses, renews and rewards their inner selves.

I first begin working with paper as a medium in architecture school while attending Rhode Island School of Design. Inherently fragile in nature, it could be torn or cut, folded or creased, layered and twisted, and ultimately magically transformed to represent a concept. But I soon discovered that what was once used for representation of a final three-dimensional idea had become a vehicle for social change. Architects were discovering ways to make paper structural and build with it.

I began experimenting with forms of my own and developed a kit of parts using paper for my thesis. Folded and glued elements could be connected, and depending on the shape they took, made structural.

My love of paper has continued and branched into different outlets. Its tactile quality, its physicality, provide limitless opportunities for new and intuitive creations. As a medium, it is so readily accessible and so inexpensive.

But, its accessibility and low-cost means it is also often and easily discarded. As such, I feel especially passionate about recycling paper when I can, even if my impact is rather small. My collages incorporate recycled paper from magazines. I love the challenge of transforming the printed image into a new image while preserving bits and pieces of the memory of the paper's former representation. My works are artistic expressions of a moment in time recreated through photorealism.

I welcome any donations of used magazines!

My works are made entirely of recycled paper and adhesive. No other medium is added. As such, the works are intensive searches through magazines for the right value, intensity, and meaning to recreate an image.

The Franklin Art Walk: begins the weekend of June 11-13th!!

Peg Munson is looking for more FAA Artists to display their art!!!

The Franklin Art Walk will begin on the weekend of June 11-13, 2021. There will be a <u>Kick-off</u> <u>Event at the Farmer's Market on the Town Common from 4-6 pm on Friday, June 11</u>. The FAA will have a booth on the common that afternoon. The kickoff will include some entertainment, and more details will be available soon about all the planned activities for that weekend.

The Mass. Cultural Council and Franklin Cultural Council have awarded a \$1,700 Grant to the FAA. This money is being used to buy easels to display art in Franklin Businesses, and to fund an art packet that will be included in the Franklin Library Summer Reading Bags. This year the Summer Reading program has a theme of Build Your Own Zoo and features a scavenger hunt to find animal art representing 12 categories of animals. The FAA is partnering with the library and the Franklin Downtown Partnership for this project. They plan to distribute 700 bags!

So far 10 FAA artists have agreed to display their art in Franklin Businesses from June 11 through the end of July. Some of these artists will be doing animal art as part of their display, and all 12 animals have been assigned. Also included in the display will be a QR code that will reveal the name and contact information of that artist, and a link to their website if they have one. Anyone interested in buying the art after the end of the Art Walk will be able to contact the artist directly.

The artists will each be paired with a business and they will work with the business to plan and set up their art display, when possible to be visible even when the business is closed.
