We are looking ahead, though, to the Spring show - and to Spring in general. I especially enjoy the plein aire experience and hope we can have some excursions for painting and photography in the scenic New England landscape soon. You should all be getting your outdoor art kits ready for the very first warm day, when scampering into the woods with your paints and paper will draw you outside, so to speak.
