Any medium, watercolors and pastels may be larger due to the matt and frame. Also photography and framed prints are welcome. The idea is to be as inclusive as possible, but in keeping with the small works tradition prior to the holiday season. This is not a juried show; its purpose is to sell and to exhibit for an extended period prior to the holidays to achieve that end. It does not matter whether you have exhibited the work before at any of the Association's past shows but all entries must have a sales price, no "not for sales" will be exhibited. And no nudes since it is a library venue.

Please provide title, medium, size and price for all paintings submitted. You can send this info in advance via email to Vailjv@aol.com or rfotland@comcast.net. This information must be provided on or before Saturday, November 3rd.

An exhibition sheet with the price list will be provided to visitors at the opening reception. No commissions will be deducted, 100% of the sale goes to the individual artist whose work is sold. You will need to be present at the opening reception if you intend to provide a bin for that day. Bins are only for the one day opening reception and must be removed at the end of the opening. All other sales during this seven week exhibit will be conducted thru contact info provided on the exhibit sheet.

November Members' Exhibition

Sets of raffle tickets will be available at the Nov. 7 meeting. Members are encouraged to sell as many tickets as possible prior to the November exhibit. The winners will be drawn Sunday afternoon. The price is one for \$1 or five for \$4. Some of you might want to purchase a set of 25 tickets for \$20 at the meeting and then reimburse yourself by selling them to friends and family. Those who prefer to take a set and return them at the exhibit with the money collected may do so by signing for them. Please put your name on the list at the meeting, stating how many tickets were taken. All completed tickets must be returned no later than 3 p.m., Sunday, Nov. 18. See Joan Callahan at the meeting for raffle tickets. The sale of raffle tickets will continue through the exhibit weekend.

The prizes are several pieces of art donated by recent demonstrating artists, as well as Bill Wallhouser and Rick Cardoza. The winners do not have to be present to win. Those who are there get first choice in the order the winners are drawn. The others will be notified by phone and will be able to choose from whatever is left.

Proceeds from the raffle go into the scholarship fund. In order to continue giving our annual scholarship to a deserving graduating senior who intends to continue his or her education in art, we need to raise at least \$1,000 each year. At present, raffles are the only source of income for the scholarship.
