SPRING ART EXHIBITION

The Spring exhibition, "WARMING UP WITH ART", will be held at the Norfolk Public Library from May 4 through May 30.

This show will be juried by Mim Brooks Fawcett, Executive Director of the Attleboro Arts Museum. There are five categories: Oil and Acrylic, Watercolor, Pastels, Mixed Media, and Photography. The awards will be: Best in Show, First, Second, and Third in each category, and two Honorable Mentions regardless of category.

Show dates: Drop Off Friday, May 2, 2 to 4 PM and Saturday May 3, 9 to 11 AM. The reception will be Saturday, May 10 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM. Please bring finger food to this event. Bin sales will be allowed at this event as well.
