Refreshments and socializing are held from 6:30pm to 7:00pm, followed by a short business meeting. A demonstration/lecture or workshop activity follows.




Fall Show Update



SMALL WORKS HOLIDAY EXHIBITION

Announcing an open invitation combining works from the Foxboro and Franklin Art Associations, sponsored by the Norfolk Cultural Council. Drop off Sat. Nov. 29th 10-4. Pick up Sat. Jan 3 in the Community Room adjacent to the Norfolk Public Library. Entry fee \$3 per entry up to six works, 12 x 16"or smaller image area. Watercolors, pastels and prints may have mats that extend beyond the 12 x 16 image limit. This is not a juried show, its purpose is to exhibit for an extended period prior to the holidays.

There are approximately 140 hanging hooks, if entries exceed that limit I reserve the right to decrease the number of entries. All entries must be properly framed with a wire backing, no sawtooths accepted. In order to have a pre-typed exhibit list with titles and prices, please notify me of your intended entries, no later then Sat. Nov 22. No nudes please since it is still a library venue. You are encouraged to bring bins and prints to the opening reception on Sat. Dec. 6. The exhibit will be advertised via press releases to local area newspapers as well as on site posters. Please provide artist, title, medium, size and price for all paintings submitted. An exhibition sheet with the price list will be provided to visitors at the opening reception. No commissions will be deducted so 100% of sale goes to the artists.

You will need to be present at the opening reception if you intend to provide a bin for that day. Bins are only for the one day opening reception and must be removed at the end of the opening. All other visitor interest in possible purchase during this exhibit will be conducted thru contact info provided on the exhibit sheet and each artist will be notified if a customer contacts us and seeks to purchase their work. To create additional interest at the opening reception there will be a video screening of a Richard Schmid demo and the public will of course be invited free of charge.
