The sun was bright, the harbor sparkling, a little fishing boat swayed to and fro next to its dock, boats in the marina still in their white plastic wraps, the church steeple shone in the noonday light, ducks paddled by, spectators stopped to watch, a rogue breeze took a palette for a ride into the water! Being one of the first warm days in March, people were out and about, lounging on the benches, reading or having a picnic lunch. Painting outside that day reminded me of how much visual information there is out there in that big world! And how much painting outdoors helps us to really observe our surroundings. Location work injects a vitality that doesn't happen in the studio. And while many find the quality of their outdoor work to be disappointing, no one can say it's not valuable." I couldn't agree more!

The spring show was a big success - the reception was well attended, and a few sales took place! Thanks to all of you who did a great job of pulling it all together. Our next opportunity to show is at Premiere Image Gallery in Ashland. mPlease see the prospectus that is attached to the end of this newsletter. FAA 2010 Scholarship

Franklin Art Association will offer its 2010 scholarship of up to \$1,000 to a graduating senior who attends high school in Franklin, or is a Franklin resident attending high school in any town (including home-schooled), or whose parent, grandparent or legal guardian is a current member of FAA. Application forms will be available soon at the Franklin high schools, online (www.franklinart.org), at a meeting, or by e-mail from Joan Callahan, joanwriter1@

verizon.net, or an officer. Applications will be reviewed, Thursday April 29th all work must be submitted for review by 3:30pm.

After completing their first semester, students must submit proof of completing the semester with grades of 2.0 or higher, proving they are satisfactorily participating in an accredited school of higher learning, with a major or minor in the visual arts. The selected student will receive the award within 90 days of submitting this proof. Students who do not comply within 15 months of high school graduation, or who decide to discontinue their arts education, will forfeit the award. In that case, the amount will remain in the scholarship account to be awarded to another qualifying recipient during a subsequent award cycle.

Call to Entries

The EMC Corporation gallery is back! They are inviting the artists of the Franklin Art Association to display their work this spring in the executive hallways of their corporate headquarters at 176 South Street in Hopkinton. This is a wonderful opportunity for exposure for the FAA as well as great sales potential for our artists as these hallways are frequented by the top executives from EMC and other Fortune 500 companies in the U.S. All members are encouraged to submit work for this rotating exhibit. Exhibition dates: April 30 – July 27, 2010

Eligibility: Open to all members of the Franklin Art Association. Only 2-dimensional work will be accepted, though all media is welcomed. All artwork must be properly framed and wired for hanging. There is no fee for submission. Work that was hung in an earlier EMC exhibition is NOT eligible for hanging in this exhibition; however, work previously submitted that was not selected may be resubmitted for consideration.

Size requirements: There are 35-40 available slots for each exhibition. The average spot will hold a 22x28" piece. **The minimum size is 9" wide by 6" high. The maximum is 32" wide (no max on height).** There is one oversized spot available that may hold a piece with a minimum size of 30" x 30" and a maximum of 42" x 42"; please note on your entry form if you are submitting a piece for the oversized spot.

Submissions: All interested parties must submit the following to be considered for selection:

- Digital photo of work, including frame, where the file name for the image is the title of the piece
- Artist name, title of piece, medium, size (including frame) shown as W x H, price, and artist email and phone number listed for each submission

There is no limit on the number of pieces you may submit for consideration. If you are submitting 4 or fewer works, you may submit by email to staceydavid@yahoo.com. If you are submitting 5 or more works, you must submit your images on CD by mailing complete packet to Stacey David at 11 Norumbega Circle, Franklin, MA 02038. All images should be saved as JPEGs, at 150 dpi, and should be approximately 3"x5" on screen; high res images are not required. If you are resubmitting work for consideration that was previously submitted, you may do so by email, noting your contact information and the title of each work; you do not need to resend the images.

Deadline: All submissions must be received no later than **April 7, 2010**.

Selection: All submitted work will be presented to EMC by the FAA. EMC will then select the pieces they wish to hang for each exhibition period. Selected artists will be notified by email no later than April 21.

Drop off: Accepted works must be dropped off on Tuesday, April 27 between 3:30 and 5:30 pm at EMC headquarters, 176 South Street in Hopkinton, with Chuck Veit. Please label the back of each piece with the artist, title, medium & price.

Pick up: Exhibited works must be picked up on Tuesday, July 27 between 3:30 and 5:30 pm at EMC headquarters, 176 South Street in Hopkinton, from Chuck Veit.

Insurance: EMC will provide insurance to cover all accepted artwork against loss or damage for the duration of the exhibition. Pieces are not covered by this insurance during transport to and from EMC.

Sales: All pieces may be for sale. EMC and the FAA will not take a commission on art sales. A price list will be available at the EMC front desk as a point of information for interested parties. Prices will not be listed on the individual pieces. Artist contact information (either email or phone number, as you specify) will be provided with each piece so that potential buyers may contact the artist directly for purchase. No piece may be removed from the walls until the end of the exhibition, unless by express written consent of EMC. Shipment and/or delivery to buyers is the responsibility of the artist and should be taken into account when pricing your work.

Replacement of sold work: If you sell a piece during the course of the exhibition, it is your responsibility to notify Chuck Veit of the sale via email at Veit_Chuck@emc.com. At that time you must also let Chuck know if you have another piece to replace the sold piece with in the exhibit. Once you have received payment for the work, you must again notify Chuck by email before he will release the piece to the buyer. If you do not have a replacement piece, Chuck will choose one from the catalog of submitted works for that exhibition.

Marketing: EMC will send an internal email to all of their associates (approximately 5,000) at headquarters announcing the exhibition and encouraging employees to view and purchase the available work. A sign will also be posted at the beginning of the gallery with an explanation of who the FAA is and who to contact for purchase information.

2010 Franklin Art Association Award Application

QUALIFICATIONS: One monetary award of up to \$1,000 may be awarded to a qualifying high school senior residing in Franklin or attending a school in Franklin, or who is a current member of the Franklin Art Association, or a senior whose parent, grandparent or legal guardian is a current member of the association. (Prior to Jan. 1 of this year, a member must have paid dues for two fiscal years. The fiscal year is Sept. 1 to Aug. 31.) After completing their first semester, students must submit proof of completing the semester with grades of 2.0 or higher, proving they are satisfactorily participating in an accredited school of higher learning, with a major or minor in the visual arts. The selected student will receive the award within 90 days of submitting this proof. Students who do not comply within 15 months of high school graduation, or who decide to discontinue their arts education, will forfeit the award. In that case, the amount will remain in the scholarship account to be awarded to another qualifying recipient during a subsequent award cycle.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION:

- 1. Application form
- 2. Student Portfolio with list
- 3. Teacher's Letter of Recommendation
- 4. Transcript of High School Grades

INSTRUCTIONS: The student is to fill out the attached application and obtain a written recommendation from his or her art instructor. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.**

All of the above requirements must be completed and submitted to the Franklin Art Association Board of Review by Thursday, April 29th between 1:45 and 3:30 p.m., at Franklin High School, Oak Street. All information will be kept confidential. Arrangements can be made for earlier delivery by calling Joan Callahan at 508-528-9184.

STUDENT PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS: Each applicant must submit a portfolio of their work containing no less than four (4) pieces and not more than eight (8) pieces of art. The attached portfolio annotation sheet must be filled in. Students are asked to submit works in a variety of mediums. All mediums will be accepted, including, and not limited to: oil, acrylic, drawing, 3D, printmaking, graphics, photography, collage, watercolor, textile, pastel, silkscreen, etc. At least one piece must be done as an **original** design concept and not executed under the direction of any instructor, either through the school or private classes. Mark this as **Item #1** on the Portfolio Annotation Sheet. All original artwork should be identified as "original." All work should demonstrate the student's best creative ability, as this will be the main criterion. The board of review will also give consideration to presentation. Originals are to be submitted in a portfolio envelope of some kind (unless they are on display at Franklin High as part of a school exhibit). Protective coverings for pastels, charcoal and other delicate works are requested. Due to the frailty or size of sculpture and 3D work, slides or photographs (2 or 3 views) may be submitted in lieu of the original, and is encouraged. If the actual piece is submitted, it must be boxed by the student for safe handling. The board of review will also be looking for students with a commitment to pursuing their education in the arts.

NOTE: Portfolios with more than 8 pieces of work will be disqualified.
