The workshop will be held on Saturday, September 18th from 10 AM until 4 PM. It will take place at the River Bend Farm in Uxbridge. The farm offers many wonderful and paintable views. Mike will begin the day with a painting demonstration in oil. There will be a break for lunch around noontime, and the day will end with a critique of our collective works. Participants should arrive by 9:30 AM for setup and for coffee and donuts.

Businesses get to swap out their artwork every year — so rather than keep the same old art hanging around, you can constantly redecorate with something fresh. We take 20% of our revenue and split it between the artists and the charity — 10% to the artists, 10% to the charity. Organization

The general management and policy-making powers of the organization are vested in the officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. Their tenure extends from September to August. Elections are held each May.

Activities

The Franklin Art Association meets on the first Wednesday of the month (except July & August). Meetings are held at the Franklin Senior Center, 10 Daniel McCahill St., Franklin, MA, with a business meeting starting at 6:45pm, refreshments and socialization starts at 6:30pm, the monthly demonstration/workshop starts at ~7pm and runs until ~9pm. In addition to the monthly meetings, which include a demonstration by a noted regional artist or life drawing session, workshops and field trips are sponsored throughout the year. Art exhibitions are held each fall and spring. The Association also sponsors a scholarship competition for graduating high school seniors who plan to continue their education in an art related field.
