With my mind's eye full of paintings, we bid farewell and head for home once again.

Plans have been finalized for FAA's booth at the Harvest Festival this weekend, again with good weather predicted. And the fall show committee is busy working on putting together our next big gala event on November 6th. If you are a new member, consider volunteering to help with the show. 


Fall Show Silent Auction Request:

We take 20% of our revenue and split it between the artists and the charity — 10% to the artists, 10% to the charity. Purpose

The purpose of the Franklin Art Association is the advancement of the arts of painting, drawing, graphics, textiles and all creative art media in the greater Franklin area. To preserve the finest artistic traditions by means of exhibiting work, conducting classes, demonstrations, lectures, and sponsoring other activities favorable to artistic expression and for the development of friendly exchanges among artists and those interested in the arts.

Organization

The general management and policy-making powers of the organization are vested in the officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. Their tenure extends from September to August. Elections are held each May.

Activities

The Franklin Art Association meets on the first Wednesday of the month (except July & August). Meetings are held at the Franklin Senior Center, 10 Daniel McCahill St., Franklin, MA, with a business meeting starting at 6:45pm, refreshments and socialization starts at 6:30pm, the monthly demonstration/workshop starts at ~7pm and runs until ~9pm. In addition to the monthly meetings, which include a demonstration by a noted regional artist or life drawing session, workshops and field trips are sponsored throughout the year. Art exhibitions are held each fall and spring. The Association also sponsors a scholarship competition for graduating high school seniors who plan to continue their education in an art related field.

Eligibility: Open to all members of the Franklin Art Association. Work must be original and not previously exhibited at any FAA shows. Artwork to be hung on display panels should be no wider than 28", including the frame. Sculpture will not be accepted in this show and there will be no easels allowed.

2. Water Media

3. Pastel/Charcoal

4. Collage/Mixed Media

5. Calligraphy/Drawing;

6. Photography

Entries: \$20 for up to 2 pieces. Check and entry form must be mailed to Barbara Evans, 1 Birchtree Circle, Franklin, MA 02038, postmarked **no later than October 26**th.

Drop-off: Friday, November 5th, from 4-6PM at Restaurant "3," 461 Central Street (Rt. 140), Franklin, MA, 2nd floor (take back stairs to the right of the entrance). All work must have title and artist name labels on the back. Entries must be properly framed or gallery-wrapped (no clip-on frames, saw-tooth hooks or, fish-line) wire only - ready for hanging. Work not meeting these guidelines will be rejected.

Commission: All work including bin sales will be subject to a 20% commission. This commission helps fund the ongoing operating costs of the Association.

Donors & Sponsors: If you wish to make a donation, please provide the amount of your donation to be included with your entry check on the attached entry form. All donors and sponsors names will be listed in the show program.

Bins: There will be 12 shared bins. Each artist may enter up to five (5) pieces (original work, prints or photos) enclosed in clear plastic envelopes. Please indicate on the attached entry form if you are willing to supply a bin for the show and if you will be bringing pieces for the bin sale.

Raffle: Please consider donating an original painting, print or photograph, matted or framed for the Scholarship Raffle. Tickets will be sold during the show until the raffle drawing at 8 PM. Contact Joan Callahan, joanwriter1@verizon.net if you have questions.

Silent Auction: Please make a little painting or supply a photograph (5" \times 7") for the silent auction. Paintings or photographs for the auction will be accepted at our Oct. 6th or Nov.3rd meeting. Paper available at the Oct. meeting. The Silent Auction will be closed for bids at 7PM.

Reception and Food: Restaurant "3" will be providing the food and a cash bar.

Awards: All work will be reviewed by a judge Saturday morning before the show. First Place, Second Place, Third Place, and Honorable Mention awards will be given for the selected pieces in each of the above categories. In addition, there will be a "Peoples Choice" award selected by show attendees. The awards ceremony will be held at 7PM.
