#### New Gallery Opening - call for artists:

My name is Cindy O'Brien and I have been presented with an opportunity to establish a new artist gallery in Mansfield, MA. The location is in downtown Mansfield across the street from the Next Door Gallery and down the street from the MMAS which has the Black Box Theatre and a gallery space as well. As the founder of the Village Artisans Collaborative in North Attleboro, I conceived the business plan which includes the offering of arts classes, artist receptions, featured artists, opportunities to hang art in venues around town and the planning and running of events which includes arts shows in the area. I also handled the marketing and promotion which has helped greatly in the exposure of the group. As the owner of this new location, I plan to continue to offer the same business plan and to work with artists to help promote their work and increase their sales.

I am offering a standard rental space size of 3ft wide from floor to ceiling for \$85.00 per month plus a commission of 10% on each sale. I am willing to split/share spaces and will offer smaller spaces depending on availability. My plan is to host a seasonal open house for the months of November and December and then establish the permanent space with a six-month contract beginning in January 2011.

There is no commitment to the permanent spot - you may take part in the 2-month seasonal opportunity and then decide if you would like to commit to the six-month contract.
