September Workshop:

Your workshop coordinator is in the process of planning a workshop to take place on Saturday, September 18th from 10 AM until 4 PM. It will be led by Mike Graves who will also be our September demonstrator. We are starting the workshop season earlier than usual in hopes that we can schedule three workshops this year. Since we haven't had a plein air workshop since Bill Ternes' in the fall of 2008, we are hoping the weather cooperates so we can paint outside once again. We have established the who and the when, but the where is still open. There are two possibilities that we are considering. The first is the River Bend Farm in Uxbridge and the other is The Beavertail State Park at the southern end of Jamestown Island in Rhode Island. The farm has a variety of views and is closer. The park is further away (90 minutes by car), but offers beautiful ocean and coastal views when everything else is still so green. For those of you who are interested, please let me know of your place preference as soon as possible.

Mike Graves is primarily an oil painter, but can offer good advice for those who choose to paint in any other medium. The workshop in open to all, but will have to be restricted to 15 participants. 
