The Franklin Library will be hosting a show for the FAA Febrary 5th - 12th, titled *For the Love of Art*. The library will also be putting together a reception for the exhibit from 2- 4PM on Feb. 5th. We hope you will take advantage of this excellent opportunity to show your work during the winter months and help us partner with the Franklin Library community. February Workshop - Painting from a Photographic Source Our second workshop for the year will be held on February 12th at Art Creations in Hopedale and will be lead by Susan Kelley of Franklin. The focus of the workshop will be on painting from photographs. Susan will give us a demonstration in oils showing how she avoids the common pitfalls of using this source material. Each participant will then attempt a painting from their own photos. The subject matter may include landscapes, portraits, still lives, or figure studies. Susan encourages the participant to attempt a painting of a type that has been problematic for the artist. She feels that this will make the workshop the most valuable. Instead of starting from scratch, the artist may also bring in a painting to work on that has given the artist particular difficulties. The workshop will be held from 9 AM until 4 PM with a break for lunch brought by each participant. Coffee and donuts will be provided at the beginning. A critique will be held near the end of the workshop. The cost is \$35 which must be submitted in cash or check at the workshop. Notification: Artists will be notified by Jan 16th whether or not they are in the first 40.

Entry Fee: NO entry fee, however, each member is limited to one piece of artwork.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Work must be original, completed within the last 3 years and not previously exhibited at the FAA show. Mono prints only, no Giclee prints for this show. All work must be properly framed or gallery wrapped (no clip-on frames or saw tooth hooks) and ready for hanging with a wire.

Size: Pieces must not exceed 16"x16" (including frame).

Labels and Waiver: Show labels are furnished by FAA. Please fill out the label and send via e-mail or US Postal service to the addresses listed below. Failure to send labels will disqualify your entry. Please attach remaining half of the labels on the work before delivery. Work must be display ready.2

<u>Artwork Pick up</u>: The pick up date for the art work is: **February 12th 9-11** The FAA is not responsible for art work left after this date and a late of \$5 handling fee per day will be charged. If work is being picked up by an individual other than you, please let us know by a note or verbal to committee member.

Judging: This show will NOT be juried.

<u>Sales</u>: Pricing and contact information must be submitted in advance so that a price list with artist information may be created for prospective buyers. All sales must be handled directly with by the artist. No commission will be taken on any work sold at the show.

Bins: There will be no bins for this show.
