Eligibility: Open to all members of the Franklin Art Association. Work must be original and not previously exhibited at any FAA shows. Artwork to be hung on display panels should be no larger than 32"x 32", including the frame. Sculpture will not be accepted in this show and there will be no easels allowed.

Categories:

1. Oils/Acrylic on canvas or board

2. Water Media under glass

3. Pastel

4. Collage/Mixed Media

Calligraphy/Drawing/Charcoal

5. Photography

Entries: \$20 for up to 2 pieces. Check and entry form must be mailed to Barbara Evans, 1 Birchtree Circle, Franklin, MA 02038, postmarked **no later than May 6**th.

Drop-off: Hayward Manor, 195 Main Street, Franklin, MA, May 20th **between 6 and 8 PM.** All work must have title and artist name labels on the back. Entries must be properly framed (no clip-on frames, saw-tooth hooks or, fish-line) wire only - ready for hanging. Work not meeting these guidelines will be rejected.

Commission: All work including bin and greeting card sales will be subject to a 20% commission. This commission helps fund the ongoing operating costs of the Association.

Donors & Sponsors: If you wish to make a donation, please indicate the amount on your entry form and included the sum in with your entry check.

Bins: There will be shared bins. Each artist may **enter up to ten (10) pieces** (original work, prints or photos) enclosed in clear plastic envelopes.

Silent Auction: Please make a little painting or supply a photograph (8"x10") for the silent auction. Paintings or photographs for the auction will be accepted at our **April 6th or May 4th** meeting. The Silent Auction will be closed **for bids on Sunday at 2:30 PM.**

Reception & Food: Reception and awards will be on Sunday from 3 to 4 PM. Commercial vendor will provide hot food. Members are asked to bring desserts.

Awards: All work will be reviewed by a judge Saturday morning before the show. First Place, Second Place, Third Place, and Honorable Mention awards will be given for the selected pieces in each of the above categories. In addition, there **will be a "Peoples Choice" award selected by show attendees. The awards ceremony will be held on Sunday at 3 PM.**

FAA Artist Trading Card Contest:

Trading cards have been around for a long time – for everything from sports heroes to cartoon characters. Classic Baseball cards have recently sold for millions of dollars at sports memorabilia auctions and kids are still frantically trading cards for things like "Pokemon" and "Yu-Gi-Oh" to the point where some schools have banned them from the classroom. So why not let Fine art have a turn at creating cards to be traded and collected?

What are artist trading cards?

According to Strathmore:

Artist trading cards (ATCs) are miniature pieces of art that are traded around the world. Artists create, trade and collect art at organized "swap" events either in person or online. It is a great way to meet other artists and share your work. The only official rule for ATCs is the size: 2.5" x 3.5"

Swaps are open to any media, materials or techniques, as long as the card fits into a standard trading card sleeve. Art can be original, limited edition or series. Artists should include the following information on the back of the card:

Name

Contact information (email, website and/or address)

Title of piece

Number of piece (if it is part of an edition or series)

ATCs are traded, not sold. However, there are some artists who choose to sell cards. Cards that are sold are called Art Card Editions or Originals (ACEO)

The FAA Contest:

Beginning with the February 2011 meeting –

All FAA members can create and swap ATCs amongst each other. The individual artist who collects the most trading cards from different artist by the February 2012 meeting will win a prize (Prize to be determined)

Rules:

Cards must fit the 2.5" x 3.5" Official size

Original artwork or series (as noted above) only

Artist name and contact information must be included

You must give a card to get a card (Swap – no purchases allowed)

Each card must be from a different artist to be counted – no duplicates allowed

Bonus points will be awarded for cards from artists Outside of the FAA

The First blank cards will be distributed at the February meeting. After that, cards can be purchased at AC Moore or Michaels. Visit www.strathmoreartist/atc for more details about the ATC movement.
