- Premier Image would like to hang at least 45 to 50 pieces and can hang around 80 pieces. All of the artwork will be accepted in the Franklin Art Assoc. show.
- Artwork will be accepted in the watermedia under glass, oil/acrylic on canvas and "other mediums" (e.g. sculpture, pastel, photography, etc.) categories
- Cash prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place pieces plus 5 honorable mention ribbons will be awarded. If there are 50 or more entries, prizes will be given for the 1st and 2nd places in each category.
- Each artist may submit up to two (2) pieces. If there are less than 50 pieces entered, artist may enter a 3rd piece.
- The entry fee is \$7.00 per piece.
- Premier Image Gallery will take a 35% commission on sales, 10% will be paid to FAA and 55% will be paid to the artist.
- Artwork must be dropped off for the Franklin Art Assoc. show on June 28th, 29th or 30th during business hours (9am to 5pm).
- The show opening will be on July 12th (6pm to 8pm) and the show will continue to be displayed until Aug. 16th when the work must be picked up.
- The gallery will also be hosting an open juried show immediately after the Franklin Art Assoc. show, with a drop off on Aug. 16th. At least one piece from each artist will be accepted in this show.
- Application forms will be available for these shows shortly at the gallery.




