

A third open juried watermedia show entitled "Favorite Things and Favorite People" will be on display Sept. 30th to Oct. 18th. Entry drop off is Sept. 17th to 23rd. The RIWS 19th annual National Show will be on display Oct 21st to Nov. 8th. October 21 - 8, "18th Annual National Watermedia Competition". Digital entries on CD only – deadline July 15. 
